# LEGISLATIVE LOOK-UP:

# UPDATE FROM LYON COLLEGE OF VETERINARY MEDICINE

The Lyon College School of Veterinary Medicine (LCSVM) continues to move forward with the creation of the first fully accredited veterinary school in Arkansas. The submission of the LCSVM Council on Education Self Study Document led to a successful COE Consultative Site visit in November 2023. The COE report contained valuable comments and no surprises. We submitted a response to the COE report by its June 1, 2024, deadline and then in August 2024 we submitted a formal request for a COE Comprehensive Site Visit. The city of Cabot graciously offered LCSVM a home, so the LCSVM will be located in Cabot. Currently being prepared for construction with dirt already being moved, the site is conveniently located just off exit 21 of Hwy 67/167 (future I-67). The architects have completed first drafts of floor plans, elevations, and the site. Cabot Animal Support Services is planning a new comprehensive facility, which will be co-located on the same site, creating unlimited possibilities for collaboration, mutual benefit, and highly valuable learning opportunities for students. Dr. Ashley Mounts has been traveling across Arkansas to identify clinics, hospitals, and other entities that are interested in becoming clinical affiliate sites and educational partners for LCSVM veterinary students. Inclusion of Arkansas veterinarians in educating future veterinarians and contributing ideas to their veterinary school will undoubtedly shape the future of veterinary education and the veterinary profession in Arkansas. Building a new veterinary school from scratch is a monumental undertaking, but the LCSVM team is up for the challenge as it marches through the necessary steps.



# **UPDATE FROM ASU CVM**

ASU continues to make progress in design of the College of Veterinary Medicine building and expansion of our CVM leadership team. The curriculum has been approved by ADHE, and a consultative visit by AVMA Council on Education site team was performed in July and the program was evaluated across 11 standards. Contingent upon the final accreditation process, Arkansas State University CVM plans to admit its first class in Fall 2026. The facility's office spaces will be planned and remodeled in the Ellis House of Nettleton in Jonesboro. So far 166 practices across the nation, and 57 in Arkansas have signed on as partner hospitals. The next steps include recruiting additional members of the leadership team, beginning construction on the CVM building, and schedule a comprehensive accreditation site visit, and recruit faculty and students.

### REVISED BYLAWS REVIEW: COMMENT PERIOD CLOSED

The comment period closed on September 5<sup>th</sup>, 2024 for the newly revised ArVMA Bylaws. This marks 7 months past the time when the ArVMA board announced the proposed changes, distributed a document containing the proposed bylaws changes at our in-person meeting as well as making this document available online. After monthly newsletters with a reminder to review and offer comment, we have officially received zero comments on the revisions. The bylaws committee will meet to review the document one final time, and will prepare the document for review and vote at the annual ArVMA Winter Meeting held in Hot Springs on February 7-9, 2025.
